Hello everyone, my name is Susan Cooper-Olawale and I have recently been elected as the Black members officer for Kent Local Government area. I am also a member of the South East Black members committee, and the Education school convenor for over 640 schools in Kent.

The reason why I decided to become active in the Union is because I realised that there were a lot of health and safety issues and workplace issues that needed addressing, especially racism. I wanted to make an impact in eradicating racism from the workplace.

Therefore, I completed the stewards training, so I could represent members at meetings regarding negotiating for better pay and conditions, sick absences, grievances, settlement agreements, mergers, and TUPE consultations.

I am also involved in reviewing policies. One policy I would like to push for is a Racial Equality policy which would be separate from the general Equalities policy which covers all protected group. Training will need to be given to employers in the workplace how to deal properly with racial incidents, as a lot of cases are not handled properly or are thrown under the radar. I realise there is a lot of work to be done, but I am eager for the challenge.

I recently attended a UNISON Black Members Leadership group pilot programme in London which recognised that not enough Black people are found in leadership roles. The programme seeks to address this and give us the tools to overcome this imbalance. I met a lot of exciting people on the programme, one of which was Margaret Greer, National Officer, Race Equality.
